Geoff Clough reported that the University has not paid us any grant in 2020 or 2021, but we have not been charged for printing and postage of the Newsletters sent in Spring 2020 and

Autumn 2021. The Autumn 2020 and Spring 2021 Newsletters were not printed but instead posted on our website.

Subscriptions have fallen from £6,235 to £6,020. The decline is largely due to fewer cheques being received and the lack of social activities due to Covid. Many thanks to our Social Members who have continued to support AOUP through these difficult times.

The Glasgow trip was postponed until May 2022. There were only two summer coach trips. The July trip to Highclere was well supported. The September trip to Stowe house and Gardens was poorly supported and we didn't fill the single coach. The Garden Party at St Hugh's College had good numbers attending in excellent weather.

Bank interest has followed the decline in rates offered by both Barclays Bank and Skipton Building Society. Barclays current deposit rate is 0.01%. Skipton Building Society offered us an improved account when we changed the signatories in September. Skipton's current rate is 0.25%

Other Income shown in 2020 was an amount received in error which was refunded in 2021

Trips, Outings and functions reflect the reduced level of activity due to Covid. Six Winter Lectures were held in 2021, but the majority were delivered using Zoom. No refreshment charges have been invoiced to date.

The New Members Evening was held, but fewer than usual numbers were in attendance. The Christmas Lunch was cancelled for the second year in a row.

There were no advance payments received for trips in 2022.

The accumulated balance of University Grant held by AOUP on 31 December 2020 was £1,146. The cost of the Newcomers' Reception and the Lectures was £1,627 so as a result the University now owes AOUP £481.

AOUP continues to be financially stable thanks to the support of our Social Members.

He proposed that the accounts should be accepted and that Tim Croft should be the Accounts Inspector again for 2022. Both proposals were accepted.
