3. Matters arising

There were no matters arising.

4. Chairman's Report

Gilliane Sills reported on activities in 2022, when things began to get back to normal after Covid.

The last two winter talks given on Zoom were Rachel Furness-Smith on "Behind the scenes of a great estate (Blenheim)" and Emma Smith on "Shakespeare's First Folio". Two visits took place: a clarinet concert at St. Michael at the Northgate and a visit to Brasenose College with Alastair Lack.

5. Treasurer's Report for the year ending 31st December 2022

A full season of outings was planned together with the week-long visit to Glasgow hence the increased income and expenditure.

7. Proposed change in Constitution

Gilliane Sills explained that Paragraph 6A at present reads:

"The Management of the Association shall be vested in a Committee which shall consist of: a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Membership Secretary, Honorary Committee Secretary, Honorary Newsletter Editor and not fewer than 5 nor more than 10 Ordinary Members".

She proposed the new wording:

"The Management of the Association shall be vested in a Committee which shall consist of: a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Membership Secretary, Honorary Committee Secretary, Honorary Newsletter Editor, Honorary Webmaster and not fewer than 5 nor more than 10 Ordinary Members".

The reason was that the Webmaster plays an important role in the running of the Association, by managing the website as a source of information and he email address lists for communication.

This change was approved by a vote at the meeting.

8. Committee Elections

Four Committee Members were co-opted during the year and were now proposed by the Committee for election. They were **Caroline Jordan**, **Suzanne Litchfield**, **Traude Molloy** and **Juliet Ralph**.

The Committee also proposed **David Bicknell** for election to the Committee and for election to the position of Vice-Chairman.
